

117 Political Prisoners Forged Applications Found

BSA-Media Centre- The BSA's financial audit council discussed a number of financial statements related to the state ministries and departments, including Al-anbar Governorate Council's statements of 2009.

The report of the audit team in charge sustained that Al-anbar Council did not follow the legal procedures that require issuance of administrative orders when appointing members of the districts and towns councils, and violated the applicable regulations by imposing fees on car registrations and cement sales. Moreover, the Council made, against the payment instructions in effect, disbursements of 29 million IQ dinars to its members, and its officers still have government cars in their custody, the status of which is unknown, without taking legal actions against them.

Also, the BSA's council discussed 2009 financial statements of the Political Prisoners Institution and discovered 117 forged applications for political prisoners, which are attached with seizure letters of movable and immovable properties, and it found that 82 of the Institution employees were appointed by falsified certificates, and that no legal actions have been taken against them.
